

Dental Assistant Program Technical Standards

Students enrolled in the **Dental Assistant** Program should be able to meet the established technical standards identified below. The technical standards for the **Dental Assistant** Program are representative of those found in the **Dental Assistant** profession.

Physical	 Student must have sufficient: Endurance, strength, mobility, balance, flexibility and coordination to perform dental procedures Gross and fine motor skills to perform administrative, clinical and laboratory skills in a timely, safe and effective manner Ability to tolerate working in confined areas Strengths to lift and position patients 	 Sit, stand, walk and maintain balance at varying intervals Bend, stretch, squat, twist, kneel and reach Good hand-eye coordination Simultaneous use of hand, wrist, fingers (both dominant/nondominant) Sitting for long periods of time Ability to perform repetitive motions Reaching forward and/or overhead Finger and manual dexterity (squeeze, grasp, twist, pinch, and manipulate small objects at varying strengths) Arm-hand steadiness 		
Sensory	Student must have sufficient:	 Color vision - detect and identify different colors Field of vision Ability to identify the subtle differences in surface characteristics Proofread Detect audible sounds (vital signs, equipment) Ability to visually detect equipment displays Ability to visually detect environmental hazards Detect objects, symbols and numbers both near and far Detect changes in skin color, temperature, swelling Detect odors (abnormal breath, alcohol, gases, fire)

Communication	Student must have effective:	 Ability to discuss and ask questions regarding patient care with patient, family, and dental health care team Ability to convey information in a clear, professional and timely manner Listen and respond to others in an accepting and respectful manner Discuss details and ask questions regarding patient care Provide clear verbal instructions to patients Establish rapport with patients and peers Listen and respond to others in a nonjudgmental, respectful manner Awareness of non-verbal communication Maintain composure with multiple responsibilities Adapt to stressful situations in a clinical setting Observe, interpret and respond appropriately to surroundings, nonverbal cues, verbal and written information 			
Safety	Student must be able to: • Apply knowledge, skills and experience to provide a safe work environment	 Work in an environment with potentially infectious materials Demonstrate adherence to safety guidelines and regulations Recognize potentially hazardous conditions and take appropriate actions Maintain immunization and health care requirements Utilize personal protective equipment (gloves, masks, eyewear, gown) Operate equipment, adhering to safety standards Identify and resolve unsafe situations Be familiar with and follow emergency procedures 			
Critical Thinking	Student must have sufficient critical thinking and problem solving skills to:	 Apply broad concepts to clinical situations Document treatment records
