Gateway to host statewide, communitywide commemoration as first technical college in America

Gateway Technical College is pleased to commemorate its 100 years as

the first technical college in America with a centennial celebration to be held July

12 on its Racine Campus, 1001 S. Main St.

Gateway is encouraging members of the communities it serves to attend

one or all of the events and celebrate 100 years of Gateway making futures for

its communities.

"Gateway Technical College is celebrating a milestone for our nation's

community and technical colleges, and we would like to invite our communities to

share in this celebration," said Gateway Technical College President Bryan

Albrecht.

Events include:

11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.: Picnic lunch. This is hosted by the Gateway Technical

College Foundation Inc. and sponsored by Johnson Bank.

1:30 p.m.: Walk ... to the future. This seven-block walk commemorates 100 years of technical education. Community members are invited to join college and technical college system staff, alumni, students and partners for the walk. It begins at Eighth Street and Center Street, the site of the first Racine Continuation School – the first continuation school in America and name predecessor to today's technical colleges. The walk will be led by members of the University of Wisconsin marching band and concludes on Gateway's current Racine campus, 1001 S. Main St.

3 p.m.: Centennial program. Wisconsin Technical College staff, business, state and national officials are all part of the historical dedication ceremony. An official plaque designating Racine and Gateway as the birthplace of the Wisconsin Technical College System will be placed on the campus.
