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Gateway designated as "Military Friendly School" by national group third straight year

For the third straight year, Victory Media, the premier publisher of magazines for military personnel transitioning into civilian life, has awarded Gateway Technical College the designation of Military Friendly School.

The 2014 Military Friendly Schools list honors the top 20 percent of colleges and universities which are doing the most to embrace America's military service members, veterans and their spouses to ensure their success as students.

This year's list is based, in part, on a survey of more than 10,000 schools nationwide approved for VA tuition funding. The survey weighting, methodology and list were independently certified by Ernst and Young.
