# POLICY GOVERNANCE REVIEW Review the Wording of Governance Policy 1.16

SECTION 1 – GOVERNANCE PROCESS 1.16: STUDENT TRUSTEE

The Board maintains the role of student trustee in order to bring the voice of the student body into its governance work. The student trustee is an unofficial, non-voting member of the Board and serves at the discretion of the Board.

- 1. The student trustee is selected by Gateway's United Student Government (USG) Organization and serves a one-year term which coincides with the term of regular Board members. The student trustee's term can be renewed for two additional one-year terms by mutual agreement of the student trustee, USG, and the Board.
- 2. The student trustee will:
  - a. Attend all open meetings of the Board. The student trustee will not attend closed/executive sessions.
  - b. Be seated with the Board members.
  - c. Report on student activities and concerns as a regular agenda item at each meeting.
  - d. Receive all non-confidential materials furnished to regular Board members with the exception of materials related to closed sessions.
  - e. Have the right to participate in Board discussion and ask questions of presenters.
  - f. Have the right to serve on ad hoc committees at the discretion of the Board Chair.
  - g. Have the right to attend professional development activities designated for student trustees.
  - h. Not be counted in regard to quorum or open meetings compliance.
- The student trustee must:
  - a. Reside in the Gateway district prior to and while serving as student trustee.
  - b. Register for twelve (12) credit hours during the academic year in which he/she serves and maintain a 2.5 program grade point average in order to serve in this role.
  - c. Attend an orientation to the student trustee role provided by the President or his/her designee.
  - d. Maintain awareness of current Board issues and read all Board materials in advance of meetings.
  - e. Maintain a working knowledge of the Board's governance concepts, policies, and operations.
  - f. Attend College events.
  - g. Present a positive image of the Board and the College to the student community.
  - h. Refer any questions regarding college operations to the President or his/her desidnee.

### Resolution No. F-2025-2026C.1

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES, SERIES 2025-2026C, OF GATEWAY TECHNICAL COLLEGE DISTRICT, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, Gateway Technical College District, Wisconsin (the "District") is presently in need of \$1,500,000 for the public purpose of financing building remodeling and improvement projects and \$2,500,000 for the public purpose of financing the acquisition of movable equipment; and

WHEREAS, the District hereby finds and determines that the projects are within the District's power to undertake and serve a "public purpose" as that term is defined in Section 67.04(a)(b), Wisconsin Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the District Board deems it necessary and in the best interest of the District to borrow the monies needed for such purposes through the issuance of general obligation promissory notes pursuant to the provisions of Section 67.12(12), Wis. Stats.;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT:

RESOLVED, that the District shall issue general obligation promissory notes in the amount of \$1,500,000 for the public purpose of financing building remodeling and improvement projects; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the District shall issue general obligation promissory notes in the amount of \$2,500,000 for the public purpose of financing the acquisition of movable equipment; and be it further

### RESOLVED, THAT:

Section 1. Note Authorization. The District shall issue the general obligation promissory notes authorized above in the aggregate principal amount of \$4,000,000 and designated "General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2025-2026C" (the "Notes"), the proceeds of which shall be used for the purposes specified above in the amounts authorized for these purposes (collectively, the "Project").

Section 2. Notice to Electors. The Secretary shall, within ten (10) days hereafter, cause public notice of the adoption of this resolution to be given to the electors of the District by publishing notices thereof in the Elkhorn Independent, Kenosha News and The Journal Times, the official District newspapers published and having general circulation in the District, which newspapers are found and determined to be likely to give notice to the electors, such notices to be in substantially the forms set forth on Exhibits A and B (collectively, the "Notices") hereto.

Section 3. Official Statement. The Secretary shall cause an Official Statement to be prepared by Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated. The appropriate District officials shall determine when the Official Statement is final for purposes of Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 and shall certify said Statement, such certification to constitute full authorization of such Official Statement under this resolution.

Section 4. Expenditure of Funds and Declaration of Official Intent. The District shall make expenditures as needed from its funds on hand to pay the cost of the Project until proceeds of the Notes become available. The District hereby officially declares its intent under Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-2 to reimburse said expenditures with proceeds of the Notes, the principal amount of which is not expected to exceed \$4,000,000.

Section 5. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the District Board or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law. If any of the Notes may be subject to a petition for referendum, any action with respect to the sale of the Notes shall be subject to the condition that no petition for referendum has been filed within thirty (30) days of publication of the Notices provided for under Section 2 of this Resolution or, if a petition is filed, that any required referendum approval is obtained.

### RESOLUTION NO. F-2025-2026C.2

### RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PARAMETERS FOR THE SALE OF \$4,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES, SERIES 2025-2026C

WHEREAS, on November 20, 2025, the District Board of the Gateway Technical College District, Racine, Kenosha and Walworth Counties, Wisconsin (the "District") adopted a resolution (the "Authorizing Resolution") which authorized the issuance of general obligation promissory notes (the "Notes") in the amount of \$1,500,000 for the public purpose of financing building remodeling and improvement projects and in the amount of \$2,500,000 for the public purpose of financing the acquisition of movable equipment (collectively, the "Project");

WHEREAS, the District will cause Notices to Electors to be published in the Kenosha News, The Journal Times and the Elkhorn Independent giving notice of adoption of the Authorizing Resolution, identifying where and when the Authorizing Resolution could be inspected, and advising electors of their right to petition for a referendum on the question of the issuance of general obligation promissory notes to finance the Project;

WHEREAS, it is the finding of the District Board that it is necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the District to direct its financial advisor, Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated ("Baird") to take the steps necessary for the District to offer and sell the Notes at public sale and to obtain bids for the purchase of the Notes; and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the sale of the Notes in a timely manner, the District Board hereby finds and determines that it is necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the District to delegate to the Chief Financial Officer/Vice President Finance and Administration (the "Authorized Officer") the authority to accept on behalf of the District the bid for the Notes that results in the lowest true interest cost for the Notes (the "Proposal") and meets the terms and conditions set forth in this Resolution (the "Parameters") by executing a certificate in substantially the form attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> and incorporated herein by reference (the "Approving Certificate").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the District Board of the District that:

Section 1. Sale of the Notes; Parameters. For the purpose of paying costs of the Project, there shall be borrowed pursuant to Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes, the principal sum of FOUR MILLION DOLLARS (\$4,000,000) upon the terms and subject to the conditions set forth in this Resolution. Subject to satisfaction of the conditions set forth in Section 15 of this Resolution, the Chairperson and Secretary are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute, issue and sell to the financial institution that submitted the Proposal (the "Purchaser") for, on behalf of and in the name of the District, the Notes aggregating the principal amount of FOUR MILLION DOLLARS (\$4,000,000). The purchase price to be paid to the District for the Notes shall not be less than 100.00% of the principal amount of the Notes.

Section 2. Terms of the Notes. The Notes shall be designated "General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2025-2026C"; shall be issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$4,000,000; shall be dated as of their date of issuance; shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof; shall be numbered R-1 and upward; and mature on the dates and in the principal amounts set forth below.

Interest shall be payable semi-annually on April 1 and October 1 of each year commencing on April 1, 2026. The true interest cost on the Notes (computed taking the Purchaser's compensation into account) will not exceed 5.00%. Interest shall be computed upon the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months and will be rounded pursuant to the rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board.

Section 3. Redemption Provisions. The Notes maturing on April 1, 2034 and thereafter are subject to redemption prior to maturity, at the option of the District, on April 1, 2033 or on any date thereafter. Said Notes shall be redeemable as a whole or in part, and if in part, from maturities selected by the District, and within each maturity by lot, at the principal amount thereof, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

<u>Section 4. Form of the Notes</u>. The Notes shall be issued in registered form and shall be executed and delivered in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> and incorporated herein by this reference.

#### Section 5. Tax Provisions.

(A) Direct Annual Irrepealable Tax Levy. For the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Notes as the same becomes due, the full faith, credit and resources of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged, and there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property of the District a direct annual irrepealable tax in the years 2026 through 2034 for payments due in the years 2026 through 2035 in such amounts as are sufficient to meet such principal and interest payments when due. The amount of tax levied in the year 2026 shall be the total amount of debt service due on the Notes in the years 2026 and 2027; provided that the amount of such tax carried onto the tax rolls shall be abated by any amounts appropriated pursuant to subsection (D) below which are applied to payment of principal of or interest on the Notes in the year 2026.

- (B) Tax Collection. So long as any part of the principal of or interest on the Notes remains unpaid, the District shall be and continue without power to repeal such levy or obstruct the collection of said tax until all such payments have been made or provided for. After the issuance of the Notes, said tax shall be, from year to year, carried onto the tax roll of the District and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes of the District for said years are collected, except that the amount of tax carried onto the tax roll may be reduced in any year by the amount of any surplus money in the Debt Service Fund Account created below.
- (C) Additional Funds. If at any time there shall be on hand insufficient funds from the aforesaid tax levy to meet principal and/or interest payments on said Notes when due, the requisite amounts shall be paid from other funds of the District then available, which sums shall be replaced upon the collection of the taxes herein levied.
- (D) Appropriation. The District hereby appropriates from taxes levied in anticipation of the issuance of the Notes, proceeds of the Notes or other funds of the District on hand a sum sufficient to be irrevocably deposited in the segregated Debt Service Fund Account created below and used to pay debt service on the Notes coming due in 2026 as set forth in the debt service schedule to be attached to the Approving Certificate.

#### Section 6. Segregated Debt Service Fund Account.

(A) Creation and Deposits. There be and there hereby is established in the treasury of the District, if one has not already been created, a debt service fund, separate and distinct from every other fund, which shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Debt service or sinking funds established for obligations previously issued by the District may be considered as separate and distinct accounts within the debt service fund.

Within the debt service fund, there hereby is established a separate and distinct account designated as the "Debt Service Fund Account for General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2025-2026C" (the "Debt Service Fund Account") and such account shall be maintained until the indebtedness evidenced by the Notes is fully paid or otherwise extinguished. There shall be deposited into the Debt Service Fund Account (i) all accrued interest received by the District at the time of delivery of and payment for the Notes; (ii) any premium which may be received by the District above the par value of the Notes and accrued interest thereon; (iii) all money raised by the taxes herein levied and any amounts appropriated for the specific purpose of meeting principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (iv) such other sums as may be necessary at any time to pay principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (v) surplus monies in the Borrowed Money Fund as specified below; and (vi) such further deposits as may be required by Section 67.11, Wisconsin Statutes.

(B) Use and Investment. No money shall be withdrawn from the Debt Service Fund Account and appropriated for any purpose other than the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes until all such principal and interest has been paid in full and the Notes canceled; provided (i) the funds to provide for each payment of principal of and interest on the Notes prior to the scheduled receipt of taxes from the next succeeding tax collection may be invested in direct obligations of the United States of America maturing in time to make such

payments when they are due or in other investments permitted by law; and (ii) any funds over and above the amount of such principal and interest payments on the Notes may be used to reduce the next succeeding tax levy, or may, at the option of the District, be invested by purchasing the Notes as permitted by and subject to Section 67.11(2)(a), Wisconsin Statutes, or in permitted municipal investments under the pertinent provisions of the Wisconsin Statutes ("Permitted Investments"), which investments shall continue to be a part of the Debt Service Fund Account. Any investment of the Debt Service Fund Account shall at all times conform with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and any applicable Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations").

(C) Remaining Monies. When all of the Notes have been paid in full and canceled, and all Permitted Investments disposed of, any money remaining in the Debt Service Fund Account shall be transferred and deposited in the general fund of the District, unless the District Board directs otherwise.

Section 7. Proceeds of the Notes; Segregated Borrowed Money Fund. The proceeds of the Notes (the "Note Proceeds") (other than any premium and accrued interest which must be paid at the time of the delivery of the Notes into the Debt Service Fund Account created above) shall be deposited into a special fund separate and distinct from all other funds of the District and disbursed solely for the purpose or purposes for which borrowed or for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Notes. Monies in the Borrowed Money Fund may be temporarily invested in Permitted Investments. Any monies, including any income from Permitted Investments, remaining in the Borrowed Money Fund after the purpose or purposes for which the Notes have been issued have been accomplished, and, at any time, any monies as are not needed and which obviously thereafter cannot be needed for such purpose(s) shall be deposited in the Debt Service Fund Account.

Section 8. No Arbitrage. All investments made pursuant to this Resolution shall be Permitted Investments, but no such investment shall be made in such a manner as would cause the Notes to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code or the Regulations and an officer of the District, charged with the responsibility for issuing the Notes, shall certify as to facts, estimates, circumstances and reasonable expectations in existence on the date of delivery of the Notes to the Purchaser which will permit the conclusion that the Notes are not "arbitrage bonds," within the meaning of the Code or Regulations.

Section 9. Compliance with Federal Tax Laws. (a) The District represents and covenants that the projects financed by the Notes and the ownership, management and use of the projects will not cause the Notes to be "private activity bonds" within the meaning of Section 141 of the Code. The District further covenants that it shall comply with the provisions of the Code to the extent necessary to maintain the tax-exempt status of the interest on the Notes including, if applicable, the rebate requirements of Section 148(f) of the Code. The District further covenants that it will not take any action, omit to take any action or permit the taking or omission of any action within its control (including, without limitation, making or permitting any use of the proceeds of the Notes) if taking, permitting or omitting to take such action would cause any of the Notes to be an arbitrage bond or a private activity bond within the meaning of the Code or would otherwise cause interest on the Notes to be included in the gross income of the recipients thereof for federal income tax purposes. The Secretary or other officer of the District charged with the responsibility of issuing the Notes shall provide an appropriate

certificate of the District certifying that the District can and covenanting that it will comply with the provisions of the Code and Regulations.

(b) The District also covenants to use its best efforts to meet the requirements and restrictions of any different or additional federal legislation which may be made applicable to the Notes provided that in meeting such requirements the District will do so only to the extent consistent with the proceedings authorizing the Notes and the laws of the State of Wisconsin and to the extent that there is a reasonable period of time in which to comply.

Section 10. Execution of the Notes; Closing; Professional Services. The Notes shall be issued in printed form, executed on behalf of the District by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairperson and Secretary, authenticated, if required, by the Fiscal Agent (defined below), sealed with its official or corporate seal, if any, or a facsimile thereof, and delivered to the Purchaser upon payment to the District of the purchase price thereof, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery (the "Closing"). The facsimile signature of either of the officers executing the Notes may be imprinted on the Notes in lieu of the manual signature of the officer but, unless the District has contracted with a fiscal agent to authenticate the Notes, at least one of the signatures appearing on each Note shall be a manual signature. In the event that either of the officers whose signatures appear on the Notes shall cease to be such officers before the Closing, such signatures shall, nevertheless, be valid and sufficient for all purposes to the same extent as if they had remained in office until the Closing. The aforesaid officers are hereby authorized and directed to do all acts and execute and deliver the Notes and all such documents, certificates and acknowledgements as may be necessary and convenient to effectuate the Closing. The District hereby authorizes the officers and agents of the District to enter into, on its behalf, agreements and contracts in conjunction with the Notes, including but not limited to agreements and contracts for legal, trust, fiscal agency, disclosure and continuing disclosure, and rebate calculation services. Any such contract heretofore entered into in conjunction with the issuance of the Notes is hereby ratified and approved in all respects.

Section 11. Payment of the Notes; Fiscal Agent. The principal of and interest on the Notes shall be paid by the Secretary or the Treasurer (the "Fiscal Agent") unless a fiscal agent is specified in the Approving Certificate.

Section 12. Persons Treated as Owners; Transfer of Notes. The District shall cause books for the registration and for the transfer of the Notes to be kept by the Fiscal Agent. The person in whose name any Note shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and payment of either principal or interest on any Note shall be made only to the registered owner thereof. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Note to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

Any Note may be transferred by the registered owner thereof by surrender of the Note at the office of the Fiscal Agent, duly endorsed for the transfer or accompanied by an assignment duly executed by the registered owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing. Upon such transfer, the Chairperson and Secretary shall execute and deliver in the name of the transferee or transferees a new Note or Notes of a like aggregate principal amount, series and maturity and the Fiscal Agent shall record the name of each transferee in the registration book. No registration shall be made to bearer. The Fiscal Agent shall cancel any Note surrendered for transfer.

The District shall cooperate in any such transfer, and the Chairperson and Secretary are authorized to execute any new Note or Notes necessary to effect any such transfer.

Section 13. Record Date. The 15th day of the calendar month next preceding each interest payment date shall be the record date for the Notes (the "Record Date"). Payment of interest on the Notes on any interest payment date shall be made to the registered owners of the Notes as they appear on the registration book of the District at the close of business on the Record Date.

Section 14. Utilization of The Depository Trust Company Book-Entry-Only System. In order to make the Notes eligible for the services provided by The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), the District agrees to the applicable provisions set forth in the Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations, which the Secretary or other authorized representative of the District is authorized and directed to execute and deliver to DTC on behalf of the District to the extent an effective Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations is not presently on file in the District office.

<u>Section 15. Conditions on Issuance and Sale of the Notes</u>. The issuance of the Notes and the sale of the Notes to the Purchaser are subject to satisfaction of the following conditions:

- (a) expiration of the petition period provided for under Section 67.12(12)(e)5., Wis. Stats., without the filing of a sufficient petition for a referendum with respect to the resolution authorizing the issuance of the Notes; and
- (b) approval by the Authorized Officer of the interest rates and purchase price for the Notes, which approval shall be evidenced by execution by the Authorized Officer of the Approving Certificate.

The Notes shall not be issued, sold or delivered until these conditions are satisfied. Upon satisfaction of the condition set forth in (b) above, the Authorized Officer is authorized to execute a Proposal with the Purchaser providing for the sale of the Notes to the Purchaser. The Notes shall not be delivered until this approval is obtained and the referendum petition period expires as provided in (a) above.

Section 16. Official Statement. The District Board hereby directs the Authorized Officer to approve the Preliminary Official Statement with respect to the Notes and deem the Preliminary Official Statement as "final" as of its date for purposes of SEC Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule"). All actions taken by the Authorized Officer or other officers of the District in connection with the preparation of such Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda to it or final Official Statement are hereby ratified and approved. In connection with the Closing, the appropriate District official shall certify the Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda or final Official Statement. The Secretary shall cause copies of the Preliminary Official Statement and any addenda or final Official Statement to be distributed to the Purchaser.

Section 17. Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure. The District hereby covenants and agrees, for the benefit of the owners of the Notes, to enter into a written undertaking (the "Undertaking") if required by the Rule to provide continuing disclosure of certain financial information and operating data and timely notices of the occurrence of certain events in accordance with the Rule. The Undertaking shall be enforceable by the owners of the Notes or by the Purchaser on behalf of such owners (provided that the rights of the owners and the Purchaser to enforce the Undertaking shall be limited to a right to obtain specific performance of the obligations thereunder and any failure by the District to comply with the provisions of the Undertaking shall not be an event of default with respect to the Notes).

To the extent required under the Rule, the Chairperson and Secretary, or other officer of the District charged with the responsibility for issuing the Notes, shall provide a Continuing Disclosure Certificate for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, setting forth the details and terms of the District's Undertaking.

<u>Section 18. Record Book</u>. The Secretary shall provide and keep the transcript of proceedings as a separate record book (the "Record Book") and shall record a full and correct statement of every step or proceeding had or taken in the course of authorizing and issuing the Notes in the Record Book.

Section 19. Bond Insurance. If the Purchaser determines to obtain municipal bond insurance with respect to the Notes, the officers of the District are authorized to take all actions necessary to obtain such municipal bond insurance. The Chairperson and Secretary are authorized to agree to such additional provisions as the bond insurer may reasonably request and which are acceptable to the Chairperson and Secretary including provisions regarding restrictions on investment of Note proceeds, the payment procedure under the municipal bond insurance policy, the rights of the bond insurer in the event of default and payment of the Notes by the bond insurer and notices to be given to the bond insurer. In addition, any reference required by the bond insurer to the municipal bond insurance policy shall be made in the form of Note provided herein.

Section 20. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the District Board or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY BORROWING IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000,000 AND ISSUANCE OF TAXABLE TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION PROMISSORY NOTES (TAXABLE REVOLVING LINE OF CREDIT)

WHEREAS, Gateway Technical College District, Wisconsin (the "District"), is temporarily in need of funds in the amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 to meet the immediate expenses of operating and maintaining the schools of the District during the current fiscal year and in anticipation of state aids, tuition revenues and taxes levied to be received by the District for the current fiscal year;

WHEREAS, technical college districts are authorized by the provisions of Section 67.12(8m), Wisconsin Statutes, to borrow money and issue tax and revenue anticipation promissory notes for such public purposes;

WHEREAS, the District Board deems it necessary and in the best interest of the District that funds be borrowed and tax and revenue anticipation promissory notes be issued pursuant to the provisions of Section 67.12(8m), Wisconsin Statutes;

WHEREAS, due to certain provisions contained in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, it is necessary or desirable to issue such tax and revenue anticipation promissory notes on a taxable rather than tax-exempt basis;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 67.12(8m), Wisconsin Statutes, the total amount borrowed shall be for the purpose of meeting the immediate expenses of operating and maintaining the schools of the District during the current fiscal year, shall not exceed one-half of the estimated receipts for the operation and maintenance of the District for the current fiscal year as certified by the District Treasurer, and the loan shall not extend beyond November 1 of the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the District Board has voted the tax for the operation and maintenance of the schools of the District for the current fiscal year to be collected on the next tax roll;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the District Board of the District that:

- 1. <u>Authorization.</u> For the purpose of meeting the immediate expenses of operating and maintaining the schools of the District during the current fiscal year and in anticipation of state aids, tuition revenues, and taxes levied to be received by the District for the current fiscal year, there shall be borrowed, pursuant to Section 67.12(8m), Wisconsin Statutes, an aggregate principal sum not to exceed \$5,000,000 ("Maximum Amount').
- 2. <u>Terms of the Notes.</u> To evidence such borrowing, the Chairperson and Secretary are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute, issue, sell and deliver to Johnson Bank (the "Lender"), for and on behalf of the District, its Taxable Tax and Revenue

Anticipation Promissory Notes (the "Notes") in an amount not to exceed the Maximum Amount and in accordance with the terms set forth on the Credit Commitment attached hereto as <u>Appendix A-I</u> (the "Credit Commitment"), which Credit Commitment is hereby approved. The Notes shall be payable to the Lender or its designee, in the denomination of \$100,000 or more in substantially the form Note.

The Note shall be dated as of its date of issuance; shall bear interest as follows: The 1 month CME Term Secured Overnight Financing Rate (SOFR) which is the forward-looking SOFR Rate administered by CME Group, Inc. (or other administrator selected by Lender) and published on the applicable Bloomberg LP screen page (or such other commercially available source providing such quotations as may be selected by the Lender) plus 235 basis points floating. The interest rate will be adjusted from time to time as CME SOFR changes. Under no circumstances will the effective interest rate be less than 2.35%. In no event will the interest rate exceed that permitted by any applicable law. Interest shall be payable from the day any amount is drawn on the Taxable Revolving Line of Credit. Notwithstanding the foregoing, at no time during the loan term shall the interest rate exceed 12.00%. Interest shall be due and payable on the 1st of each month during the time any disbursement or draw remains outstanding. The Note shall mature on November 1, 2026.

- 3. <u>Redemption Provisions.</u> The Notes are subject to redemption at the option of the District in whole or in part at any time without penalty.
- 4. <u>Sale of Note.</u> This District Board authorizes and directs the Chief Financial Officer/Vice President of Finance and Administration of the District (the "Financial Officer") to execute and accept the Credit Commitment, in the name and on behalf of the District.
- 5. <u>Disposition of Proceeds of Notes.</u> Proceeds of the Notes ("Note Proceeds") shall be used solely for the purposes for which borrowed or for the payment of the principal of and/or interest on the Notes. Note Proceeds may be temporarily invested in legal investments until needed.
- 6. <u>Irrepealable Tax; Segregated Fund.</u> So long as the Notes, or interest thereon, remain unpaid, the tax for operation and maintenance of the District (including the amount budgeted to pay interest on the Notes) shall be and continues irrepealable. The District shall segregate in a special fund, state aids, tuition revenues, taxes levied and other available revenues received for operation and maintenance of the District sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Notes as the same becomes due. Said special fund shall be used for the sole purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Notes. If there shall be insufficient sums in said special fund to meet such payments, the District shall promptly pay the same when due from other monies available in or attributable to the current fiscal year. This covenant specifically includes monies attributable to the current fiscal year which are not received prior to the end of the current fiscal year.
- 7. Execution of the Notes. The Notes shall be executed on behalf of the District by the Chairperson and Secretary, sealed with its official or corporate seal, if any, and delivered to the Lender upon payment to the District of the purchase price thereof, plus any accrued interest to the Closing. In the event that any of the officers whose signatures appear on the Notes shall cease to be such officers before the delivery of the Notes, such signatures shall, nevertheless, be valid and sufficient for all purposes to the same extent as if they had remained in office until such delivery.
