Having reviewed the bids with Mr. Thielen, and yourself, Gateway has decided to accept the base bid and both alternate bids. We are recommending that the College enter into a contract with Absolute Construction to complete the Culinary Demonstration/Classroom Renovation.

Based on our bid evaluation, we further recommend that the contract value be \$241,400.00. Gateway should also budget approximately \$27,330.00 for architectural and engineering fees as well as budget \$400.00 for reimbursable costs related to the competitive bid process. Included in the architectural and engineering fees is a study that conducted to determine the scope for this project and others.

The preliminary General Fund results for fiscal year 2013 are as follows:

Overall Results

Preliminary results show a favorable variance of \$3.5 million. This includes a \$1M transfer out to the Capital Fund. A portion of the fund balance is due to vacant positions; benefits budgeted at family for all vacancies; increased grant spending and a budget for long term health care that settled in the prior year.

Expenses went under budget by \$5,671,143 while revenues were under budget by \$1,131,163.

Revenues

Overall, total revenues were slightly unfavorable by 1.4% or \$1,131,163. The decrease is due largely in part to a reduction in program & material fees of \$1,534,677 or 21.4% as well as high school contracts of \$460,899 or 76.8%. The decreases were offset by an increase to state aid of 7.2% or \$368,137; and Bookstore Revenues increase of 38.6% or \$183,226 and Other Revenues were favorable by \$178,073 or 61.4%

Expenses

Overall, expenses were under budget by \$5,671,144 or 7.2%. The decrease is due largely in part to savings of 11.1% or \$2,315,601 in Administration and Instructor Salaries; 19% or \$356,921 in Professional Non Faculty expenses; 85.5% or \$345,279 in Instructor Overload and 28.6% or \$342,854 in Extended Contracts. There was an increase of 28.6% or \$1,124,624 in Adjunct Instruction. As in past years, the increase in Adjunct salaries is offset by the decrease in hiring full time faculty to accommodate change in enrollment.

Employee benefits were under budget by \$2,527,708 or 13.7%. The decrease is due largely in part to Health & Dental Insurance savings of \$1,762,058 or 17.3% and Social Security and Retirement of 18.4% or \$602,686. These savings were driven by unfilled full-time positions which were budgeted at family coverage.

Other expenses including Supplies were slightly under budget by 1.6% or \$207,912. Utilities posted a savings of \$230,997 or 14.5%; Rentals incurred a savings of \$199,063 or 19.6% and Supplies realized a savings of \$100,861 or 6.3%. Uncollectible Fees were over budget by 81.5% or \$322,119.

The General Fund reserve for operations is expected to be \$23.4M as of June 30, 2013 or 30% of revenues budgeted for FY 2014. As approved within the FY14 budget, \$1M will be transferred to offset capital purchases. Management is recommending the remaining fund balance be used to offset a growing OPEB liability as well as reserve for capital infrastructure and equipment. This proposed usage will result with a fund balance within the 17% - 25% range as specified in the Board's Executive Limitation.

Special Revenue Fund

The Special Revenue Fund is used to account for all grant-related activities. The fund experienced a favorable financial result for FY 2013 with revenues exceeding expenses by \$505,472. A yearend budget revision will be necessary to reallocate the budget within functions.

Capital Projects Fund

The Capital Projects Fund is used to account for financial resources and related financial activity for the acquisition and improvement of sites and for the acquisitions, construction, equipping and renovation of buildings. Revenues reflect fiscal year debt issues totaling \$12 million; \$1.5M of institutional revenue; and a \$1M transfer from the General fund. Overall, the Capital Project Fund reflects total expenses of \$14.0 million and revenues of \$13.0 million. The Capital Projects fund balance increased by \$621,413. Year-end budget revision will be necessary to reallocate the budget within functions.

Debt Service Fund

The Debt Service Fund is used to account for the accumulation of resources for, and payment of, general long-term debt principal and interest. The fund revenues exceeded expenses by \$66,383 due to favorable market conditions and lower than expected interest costs. Principal and interest payments totaled \$8.4 million in FY13.

Enterprise Fund

The Enterprise fund is used to account for operations where the costs of providing goods or services to the student body, faculty and staff or the general public are financed primarily through user fees. The fund experienced a positive financial result with revenues exceeding expenses by \$73,915.

Overall, the College's financial condition remains strong and well positioned to meet future fiscal challenges.
