### **Overall Results**

Preliminary operating results show revenues exceeding expenditures by \$2.4 million which will be the net increase to the fund balance. The operational savings are mainly due to savings in expenditures such as travel, professional development, supplies, uncollectable fees and various others. There was also savings due to vacant position savings throughout the year and benefits budgeted at family for all vacancies.

### **Fund Balance/Reserves**

Fund balance is a combination of previous fund balance, net revenues over expenditures, adjustments for prepaid expenditures and transfers out to other funds. As a matter of sound financial practice, fund balance should only be used to support one-time initiatives, as opposed to ongoing operational expenditures. In any year, the amount by which net expenditures exceed net revenues, will cause a direct reduction in fund balance.

Prepaid expenditures are those expenditures paid in the current year for services to be provided in subsequent years. They are "shifted" to the appropriate year through the use of reserves. Prepaid expenditures mainly include expenditures for maintenance agreements, IT contracts, memberships, purchasing consortium expenditures, etc.

Management is recommending fund balance be monitored for policy adherence and possible use to offset the OPEB liability.

The General Fund reserve is expected to be \$28.7 million as of June 30, 2022, or 33.6% of actual FY22 expenditures. To align with the WTCS Financial and Administrative Manual and comply with district policy, administration is recommending the fund balance be allocated to various designations as follows:

### Revenues

Overall, total revenues were unfavorable to budget by 1.3% or (\$1,162,650) mainly because the \$1,000,000 budgeted use of reserves was not needed, resulting in actual revenues being lower than budgeted revenues which has an unfavorable effect on revenues.

Contract revenue was over budget by \$486,633 or 20.1%. State aid revenue was over budget by \$269,903, and tax levy revenue was slightly over budget by \$47,108. In addition, Transcripted Credits revenues were over budget by \$240,968 or 6.9% due to the increased outreach to the K12 districts. Transcripted Credit revenue is considered a "wash" with Transcripted Credits expenditures; therefore, it has no effect on overall year end results.

Offsetting these increases, was a decrease in tuition revenues of \$1,214,451 or 7.4%, due mainly to the fact that enrollment was down from budget assumptions at year end.

### **Expenditures**

Overall, total General fund expenditures were under budget by \$3,569,631 or 4.0%.

*Total salaries* were slightly over budget \$309,422 or .06% due to some prior year adjustments made in the current year.

*Employee benefits* were under budget by \$831,878 or 4.2%. The variance is due largely to savings from the timing of filling vacant positions and savings from vacant positions that are budgeted at family rates when staff may choose single rates at the time of hire.

Other expenditures were under budget overall by \$3,047,176 or 17.2%. Transcripted Credit expenditures were over budget by \$240,968 or 6.9%. This variance is a "wash" with a revenue variance of the same amount (discussed in revenue section). Various other expenditures were under budget. The larger expenditure variances include travel, professional development, uncollectable expenses, supplies, advertising, printing, insurance, computer software, etc., by a collective \$3,288,139 or 23.1%. These savings were mainly attributed to management's focus on controlling expenditures responsibly to manage the effects of the decrease in enrollment.

### **Special Revenue Fund**

The Special Revenue fund is used to account for all grant-related activities. The fund experienced an

unfavorable financial result for FY 2022 with expenditures exceeding revenues by \$1,213,174 due to the transfer of HEERF funding to the General fund during the fiscal year. A year-end budget revision will be necessary to reallocate the budget within functions.

### **Capital Projects Fund**

The Capital Projects fund is used to account for financial resources and related financial activity for the acquisition and improvement of sites and for the acquisitions, construction, equipping, and renovation of buildings. Revenues reflect fiscal year debt issues totaling \$15 million. Overall, the Capital Projects fund reflects total expenditures of \$17.8 million and revenues and other financing sources of \$18.3 million. The Capital Projects fund balance increased by \$479,637. A year-end budget revision will be necessary to reallocate the budget within functions.

### **Debt Service Fund**

The Debt Service fund is used to account for the accumulation of resources for, and payment of, general long-term debt and lease obligation principal, interest, and related costs. The fund revenues exceeded expenditures by \$462,348 due mainly to higher premiums received on issuances. Principal and interest payments totaled \$16.2 million in FY22.

### **Enterprise Fund**

The Enterprise fund is used to account for operations (other than for the general operations) that are financed and operated in a manner similar to a private business enterprise, where the intent of the College is that the costs of providing goods or services to the general public on a continuing basis be financed or recovered primarily through user charges. The operations of the District's culinary arts, auto labs and miscellaneous student auxiliary items are accounted for in the Enterprise fund in a manner similar to accounting for private enterprise operations. The fund experienced an unfavorable financial result with expenses exceeding revenues by \$96,944.

### Summary

Overall, the College's financial condition remains strong as we continue to make the strategic decisions necessary to recover from the impact of COVID-19 on enrollment and meet future fiscal challenges.

The College continues to hold a bond rating of Aaa, the highest rating as provided by Moody's Investors Services.

Moving forward, management will continue to focus on enrollment trends, retention rates, community needs, and economic indicators to ensure responsible fiscal management.

### SECTION 3 - EXECUTIVE LIMITATIONS POLICY 3.5 FINANCIAL CONDITION

The President shall not cause or allow the development of fiscal jeopardy or a material deviation of actual expenditures from the Board's Ends policy with regard to actual, on-going financial condition and activities.

Without limiting the scope of the foregoing statement, the President shall not:

- 1. Fail to comply with administrative codes, rules, or regulations set forth by agencies with recognized authority over specific college activities, including administrative policies and rules of Gateway Technical College.
- 2. Expend more funds than have been received in the fiscal year without prior Board approval.
- 3. Indebt the organization in an amount greater than can be repaid by otherwise unencumbered revenues within the current fiscal year or can be repaid from accounts previously established by the Board for that purpose.
- 4. Permit conflicts of interest in awarding purchases or contracts.
- 5. Fail to maintain adequate combined operating fund balance reserves sufficient to provide for an average of two (2) months' operating expenses, but not to exceed an amount equal to an average of three (3) months' operating expenses.
- 6. Fail to apply for aid from all sources of funding when eligible except when not in the best interests of the College.
