

Paying for College

Gateway is eager to assist you in making college affordable through tuition payment options, federal and state financial aid programs, and Gateway Foundation and other scholarships. Gateway's tuition and fees are set by the Wisconsin Technical College System Board each year. The inside of this brochure details the estimated cost by program.

Options for paying for college can include any one or combination of the following:

Pay Fees in Full

Pay fees in full by cash, check or credit card online at gtc.edu or at Student Services.

Student Payment Plan

A student payment plan is available for students taking three or more eligible credits. Students enroll in the plan and make a required deposit (40 percent of tuition and fees). After the deposit is paid, two installments are established.

Employer Tuition Reimbursement Program

Often employers will reimburse part or all of a student's tuition. Check with your employer's Human Resources office for details on available programs at your workplace.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available each year including specific high school and continuing student scholarships through the Gateway Technical College Foundation and outside sources. Information, deadlines, and applications are available at gtc.edu/scholarships.

Veterans Benefits

The majority of programs offered by Gateway are approved for U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs educational benefits. Benefits are available through the Wisconsin Department of Veteran Affairs and/or the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs. Information is available at gtc.edu/va.

Financial Aid

Gateway ensures access to higher education by awarding financial aid according to federal guidelines to students who do not have the financial resources. Financial aid is assistance to help students of any age meet educational costs. Financial aid may be in the form of federal and/or state grants, federal workstudy, and/or federal student loans. Student loans must be repaid.

Students may be eligible for financial aid if:

- · Resources (savings, earnings, parent contribution) are less than the cost of attendance at Gateway. Cost of attendance includes; tuition and fees, books and supplies, room and board, transportation, and personal expenses for associate degree and technical diploma programs.
- The student is enrolled in a program that requires at least 16 credits to complete.

- You are registered for at least six credits worth of classes during a semester.
- You are a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.

Gateway encourages all students to apply for financial aid. You can apply for financial aid throughout the year; however, to ensure your aid is processed before the start of term, follow the priority application dates below.

Summer Semester: Apply by March 1 Fall Semester: Apply by July 1 **Spring Semester: Apply by November 1**

Flexibility

Gateway offers day, evening, Saturday, and online courses so students can finish their degree within two years of full-time attendance, or work full time and take courses when they can. Many students get entry-level jobs in their field while also taking classes, and advance in their position at the company once they graduate.

Hands-on Training

Many graduates say the career-oriented learning approach is what they liked best about their Gateway education. Some instructors have class projects involving learning while on the job at nonprofit organizations. Some club activities offer opportunities for career-oriented projects for area businesses or personal development.

Diversity

Gateway encourages a diverse population in terms of age, race, gender, and life experiences. The average age of a Gateway student is 32 years old; 31 percent of the student population is nonwhite; 51 percent is female. Our students include recent high school graduates, career changers, incumbent workers seeking skill upgrades, women returning to the workforce after raising families, and workers who lost their jobs due to company closings.
