

## Associate of Arts Courses by Category

- Students must earn a minimum number of credits in each category, listed below, and earn a total of 60 credits in order to be conferred the degree.
- A minimum 2.0 cumulative G.P.A. and a minimum grade of 'C' or better for each course is required for graduation.
- Although some courses are listed in more than one category, courses may only be applied toward one category. Once the course is applied to a specific category, it cannot be applied to a second category.
- Additional course offerings are available through outside institutions, including UW-Parkside. Courses completed at other institutions may transfer in and be applied toward select categories. See your academic advisor for more information.
- 890-155 Gateway to Success must be taken within the first semester.
- All courses listed below may also serve as elective courses for this program. Additional elective courses that are accepted for this degree are listed at the end.
