Respiratory Therapy (10-515-1)

Respiratory therapists see patients with diseases, infections and viruses of the cardiopulmonary system, such as lung cancer, asthma, emphysema, bronchitis and pneumonia. Common respiratory care includes managing mechanical ventilation life support systems, assessing the cardiopulmonary status of patients, drawing blood samples, performing blood gas analysis and pulmonary function testing, initiating ordered respiratory care, evaluating and monitoring patients' responses to such care and modifying the prescribed respiratory therapy and cardiopulmonary procedures. Respiratory therapists also provide patient, family and community education, and participate in life support activities as required.

- 1 Apply respiratory therapy concepts to patient care situations.
- 2 Demonstrate technical proficiency required to fulfill the role of a Respiratory Therapist.
- 3 Practice respiratory therapy according to established professional and ethical standards.

Admission Requirements

- 1 Students must submit an application and pay \$30 fee.
- 2 Students must meet one of the following: minimum cumulative high school GPA of 2.6 (unweighted); earned at least 12 college credits with a minimum GPA of 2.0; or complete valid reading, writing, and math placement assessments.
- 3 Review the technical standards for this program at www.gtc.edu/forms. An acknowledgement of these standards will be completed within the online application.
- 4 This is a high demand program that utilizes a [priority placement](#) process for enrollment in core program courses. Students admitted into this program progress through three stages pre-core, core-ready and core-active as they work to complete their degree. Students are selected to become core active based on application date, completion of academic preparedness requirements and district residency. Academic preparedness requirements may include a background disclosure form, criminal background check, and official high school, GED or HSED transcript including a graduation or passing date.

Gateway Technical College reserves the right to modify curriculum requirements for students who interrupt enrollment for one year or take over seven years to complete. Tuition and material fees are determined by the board of the Wisconsin Technical College System. Consult My Gateway for exact fee amounts. The District reserves the right to modify, cancel, or relocate course offerings in response to factors such as low enrollment, resource availability, or other relevant considerations to ensure high-quality educational experiences. Students will be notified in writing and are encouraged to meet with their Academic Advisor to adjust their academic plan.

Graduation Requirements

- 1 Minimum 63 credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above.
- 2 *Minimum of 2.0 ("C") or above for these major courses.
- 3 All courses must be completed to be eligible to take the RRT exam.
- 4 Complete 890-155 Gateway to Success (G2S) in the first semester.

- 1 A physical examination and immunization are required prior to admission to the first clinical course. Clinical sites may require proof of health insurance.
