**Gateway historic display to end in Elkhorn,
move to Racine**

A historic display commemorating Gateway's 100 years as an institution and as the first technical college in America will shift its tour of the Gateway Technical College District. It will end its presentation at the college's Elkhorn Campus, 400 County Road H on June 23, and move to the Racine Campus, 1001 S. Main St. where it will be open for viewing beginning June 27.

The commemorative display will remain on the Racine Campus available for public viewing in the student commons during the hours when the campus is open until Oct. 13, which includes being one of the centerpiece displays during a communitywide and statewide July 12 celebration at the campus.

"Our place in history can only be defined by those who dedicated their careers to serving students, businesses and communities that make up the Gateway Technical College District," said Gateway President Bryan Albrecht. "The students, faculty and professional staff are our stepping stones into the next century of learning."

The large, circular display provides an insight into the images and impact Gateway has had on the communities it serves through education and its role as a key player in the area's economic engine.

Gateway extended the presentation of the display at the Elkhorn Campus
for an extra week.
