**National training partnership to be announced
Gateway Technical College as pilot**

Gateway Technical College is the first in the country to roll out a new transportation-related national certification training program. The program will be unveiled during an announcement at 10:30 a.m. July 16 at Gateway Technical College's Horizon Center for Transportation, 4940 88th Ave. (Highway H), Kenosha, Wis.

At the same time, the organization's train-the-trainer event attracts more than 100 transportation and energy instructors from throughout the country to Gateway Technical College facilities to become certified so they can then offer training leading to certification to students at their own colleges or high schools.
