The Gateway Technical College Alumni Association has named Mary Kubicki as Gateway Technical College's 2019 Distinguished Alumni.

Kubicki earned a Supervisory Management degree from Gateway Technical College in 2012 and currently serves as the Kenosha County Clerk, a position she has held since 2009.

It is awarded during commencement ceremonies in May. This year's commencement is May 21.
