Nine Gateway apprentice students receive **Tools of the Trade scholarships** 

Nine Gateway Technical College apprentice students were awarded

\$1,500 Ascendium Education Group Tools of the Trade scholarships to help

them cover out-of-pocket expenses such as tuition, tools and clothing so that

they are able to complete their training.

The Gateway apprentices are part of a statewide effort by Ascendium –

formerly Great Lakes Higher Education Guaranty Corporation – to award

\$298,500 in scholarships to 199 construction and industrial trade apprentices

attending Wisconsin Technical College System colleges.

Since the program's inception, 95 percent of Tools of the Trade scholarship recipients have either completed or continued their apprenticeships the following semester. This year, Ascendium surpassed the \$1 million mark in total Tools of the Trade scholarships awarded.
