## Kenall Manufacturing CEO keynotes Gateway graduation ceremony

Jim Hawkins, CEO and owner of Kenall Manufacturing, encouraged graduates at Gateway Technical College's Associate Degree and Technical Diploma Commencement to become the leaders they were meant to be, through self-reflection, persistence and integrity.

"Leadership takes many forms and is not always obvious," Hawkins told the 373 students who participated in the ceremony. "Let me tell you from my experience a few ways you can lead and make the world a better place.

Hawkins encouraged graduates to be courageous, unafraid of failure, accept responsibility for their actions and surround themselves with people who are honest and expect the best from them.

The ceremony recognized 840 prospective candidates for graduation from Summer 2015, Fall 2015, Spring 2016 and Summer 2016 semesters. An estimated 373 participated in the ceremony. "For some of us, this may be our second chance to be on the correct career path and Gateway is the catalyst to make a wrong right," said Class of 2016 Student Responder Vicki Zirbel, the Elkhorn Campus Ambassador and graduate of Gateway's CNC Production Technician diploma program.

"We are thankful to have our family and friends here to celebrate with us as graduates this evening. Hard work, dedication, hours of studying for mid-terms and finals – sometimes through tears and frustrations – you were there for us, sacrificing and making our education a priority."
