**Keynote to graduates: You're entering the workforce** at the perfect time, with the right education

Other commencement highlights included the presentation of the 2018 Gateway Technical College Alumni Association Distinguished Alumni Award to Sharbel Maalouf. Maalouf earned a Gateway Technical College Marketing degree in 2008 and currently serves as vice president for product development at Medline in its ReadyCare Division.

Yesenia Martinez-Hall, a 2018 Business Management associate degree program graduate, spoke as the student responder.

Said Martinez-Hall: "From the moment we students make the decision to embark on our educational journey at Gateway, we made the choice to change our path and improve our futures. The tools we've learned and the skills we've gained while being students here are incomparable to anything we have previously experienced, and the education we earned will help ensure our future success in whatever path we've chosen."
