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Governor visits Gateway to promote advanced manufacturing skills initiative

Governor Scott Walker chose Gateway's SC Johnson integrated

Manufacturing and Engineering Technology Center in Sturtevant today as a site

to promote his new workforce initiative, noting that the type of advanced

manufacturing training that goes on at the center fuels business and economic

growth.

Walker promoted Act 139, which provides a \$35.4 million increase to the

Wisconsin Fast Forward program to be used to provide workforce training grants

to technical colleges, among other initiatives. He called Gateway relevant to

students, employers and the communities it serves, helping to train workers in

those high skilled manufacturing areas which are in need of workers.

"When I talk to employers, they say that for us to continue to grow is to fill

not only the positions of today, but also for tomorrow," Walker said.

The additional funds of Act 139 will be used to provide workforce training

grants to technical colleges, grants for collaborative projects among school

districts, technical colleges, and businesses, as well as grants to enhance

employment opportunities for persons with disabilities.

"Targeted investments in worker training will develop the highly-technical, dependable workforce Wisconsin is known for," Governor Walker said. "The economy is continuing to improve and businesses are expanding and hiring, but they need to have skilled workers to fill in-demand positions.

"The Wisconsin Fast Forward program will ensure job seekers are adequately trained to be able to jump into the workforce when an opportunity comes along."

Walker's speech was given in Tarnowski Hall of the SC Johnson iMET Center, a facility which features advanced manufacturing equipment and the only flexible manufacturing training center in the region.

Gateway Technical College collaborates with communities in Kenosha, Racine and Walworth counties to ensure economic growth and viability by providing education, training, leadership and technological resources to meet the changing needs of students, employers and communities.
