The lab was made possible through a generous donation by Thelma Adams Meyer to the Gateway Technical College Foundation Inc. in honor of her late parents Rex and Amanda Adams.

"We are grateful for Thelma Meyer's commitment to education and honoring the memory of her parents," said Gateway Technical College Foundation Executive Director Jennifer Charpentier. "Generations of students will benefit from her parents commitment to hard work and her generosity."
