To apply to a program or certificate, complete the WTCS Application for Admission. The application can be found online at www.gtc.edu/forms. Please be sure to answer all questions.

- Pay your non-refundable \$30 application fee either online at www.gtc.edu/webadvisor or at a Gateway campus near you.
- Check www.gtc.edu/admissions for other program admission requirements and to answer questions you may have.
- Sign up for your placement assessment. One assessment is included in your application fee. The assessment is \$15 for those who do not pay the application fee. Fees apply to additional testing appointments.
- ✓ We strongly urge you to review prior to the assessment. Study materials are found at www.gtc.edu/testing.
- Request official high school, GED/HSED, and college transcripts from schools attended. To be considered official, transcripts must be mailed directly from the issuing school to Gateway Technical College.
- ✓ Don't wait! Apply for Financial Aid online at www. fafsa.ed.gov. You can complete your application for admission and financial aid at the same time.
- Register for classes online at www.gtc.edu/webadvisor.
 You can register for any classes for which you meet the prerequisite.
- See your advisor for assistance with course selection and academic planning.

Those applying to programs not requiring an application fee, payable to Gateway, must pay for their placement assessment prior to taking it.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

This application form is the first step toward admission to any program (major) in the Wisconsin Technical College System. Once the college receives the form and appropriate fee, it will send you further information on requirements and/or procedures.

General Instructions

- Complete all sections of the form.
- Please print clearly.
- Consult the college of your choice for application dates, specific program (major) information and other details.
- If you wish to apply for admission to more than one Wisconsin technical college, submit a separate application form and application fee **directly to each college**.
- Apply early!

Application Fee

- Attach the \$30 nonrefundable application fee to each application you complete. Send a check or money order made out to the college; do not send cash.
- Each application must include the \$30 application fee.
- The \$30 fee (per college) is a one-time-only fee.

Transcripts

- Request official copies of all academic transcripts, including high school, Tests of General Educational Development (GED[®] Test), HSED, college or university. Contact each institution and ask to have your official transcripts mailed directly to the Admissions Office of the college(s) to which you are applying.
- If you are still enrolled in high school, send a transcript of the courses you have completed, along with a list of the courses to be taken prior to graduation.

Testing/Assessment

- Many Wisconsin technical colleges require testing for acceptance into specific programs. Test results are generally used to place you in courses and/or programs where you can succeed academically.
- If you have taken the ACT or SAT, please send your score report to the college.
- · Contact the college for testing requirements.
- Accommodations are available for students with special needs.

Disclosing Your Social Security Number:

The Wisconsin Technical College System may request and use your social security number for record keeping and statistical purposes related to auditing, enforcing and evaluating Federallysupported education programs (Federal law 20 U.S.C. § 1232g (1998)). You are required to provide your social security number if you are, or will be, applying for financial aid. If you will not be applying for financial aid, then providing your social security number is optional. However, there may be a delay associated with processing your application while an alternate number is assigned.
